CHINESE BRUSH CALLIGRAPHY COURSE INTRODUCTION TO CHINESE CALLLIGRAPHY

The Chinese name for calligraphy is shūfǎ (书法), literally "the way, method, law of writing". The calligraphy of Chinese characters is an important and appreciated aspect of Chinese culture. Chinese calligraphy is normally regarded as the "art" of writing. To treat it as a practice of writing Chinese characters, learners may imitate the exemplary pieces of writing without aspiring to artistic creation. To treat it as an art, learners may appreciate the calligraphic works for aesthetic purposes.

COURSE OVERVIEW:

The course of Chinese Brush Calligraphy is intended for those who have some proficiency of Chinese language and want to practice the writing of Chinese characters with brush and those who, although without any Chinese proficiency, simply want to treat it as an art. The calligraphy course will focus on the basic skills of writing the strokes of the Chinese characters, writing of complete characters, writing of some short ancient Chinese poems, some basic writing styles of the calligraphy, and appreciation of the writing art with brush. Class activities include the learning of writing skills, the practicing of writing with ink, and the appreciating of Chinese calligraphy's samples.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Students will learn:

- * how to write the basic strokes of the Chinese characters;
- how to write a complete character;
- some styles of the Chinese calligraphy;
- * some ancient Chinese poems.

Moreover, students will have the chance to appreciate the aesthetic art of writing Chinese characters.

Each lesson includes explanation and teaching time and practicing time.
